

THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT:

SOCIAL MEDIA

- 1. The Internet does not change your duty to maintain boundaries with your patients and you should avoid interacting with them on personal social media sites. If a patient attempts to contact you via a social media site, you should make it clear to them that you do not communicate with patients by these means and will not respond to further attempts at contact.
- 2. State licensing boards can and have disciplined physicians for inappropriate online behavior. This includes depictions of such things as excessive drinking and suggestive content as well as misrepresentation of credentials.
- 3. Privacy controls are not an absolute guarantee that your information can't/won't be viewed by those other than you had intended. Once you have posted something, it may be copied and forwarded to others. Never post anything that you would not want a patient, colleague, employer, or licensing board to see.
